SOLAR POWERED MOBILE SURVEILLENCE CAMERAS (SPMSC):

- Autonomous surveillance system that uses solar power for its cameras and elevated lift mechanism
- Each system is fitted to a wheeled trailer which increases its agility and mobility for use in multiple environments
- Augments Authority's Security Posture



BENEFITS

- Provides additional Security (More MARTA projects, State of Good Repair/Station Rehabilitation, Track Replacement projects)
- Serves as a criminal activity deterrent and investigative tool where deployed
- Mobility and size allow rapid deployment at locations not presently covered by CCTV
- A cost-effective solution (short term and longer term) instead of costs associated with hardwiring new cameras
- Assists the Authority in mitigating risks identified through Threat & Vulnerability Assessments (TVA), Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED), internal reports, external state safety oversight (Georgia Department of Transportation), Transit Security Administration Baseline Assessment reports





Technical Specs

- □ 700 Watts of Solar Power
- ☐ On Board back up system (power failure/lack of solar power)
- ☐ Trailer raised suspension height at least 20 ft
- ☐ Record and store up to 30 days video footage
- ☐ Connects to MARTA network/Genetec CCTV/ Cloud Based
- ☐ Can be monitored remotely (Police Communications Center (PCC) /Emergency Operations Center (EOC) /Integrated Operations Center(IOC)
- ☐ Trailer equipped with lockable storage cabinets & will be stored at Candler Park and MARTA Police Precincts for ease in deployment
- ☐ Vendor will provide on site training & Ongoing Technical Support
- ☐ Vendor will provide (1) year software/hardware support & maintenance
- ☐ Includes (1) Cyber security support inline with MARTA Cyber Security Patch Management Policy



Invitation for Bid (IFB) Solicitation Process

- Commenced solicitation with release of IFB on 8/24/2022
- Seven (7) Invitations for Bids were received by the due date of 10/10/2022
- Bids were evaluated from seven (7) bidders on 10/11/2022
- ECAM Secure Inc was selected as the vendor for award





Summary


- ECAM Secure Inc. was has been selected as the lowest, responsive and responsible bidder.

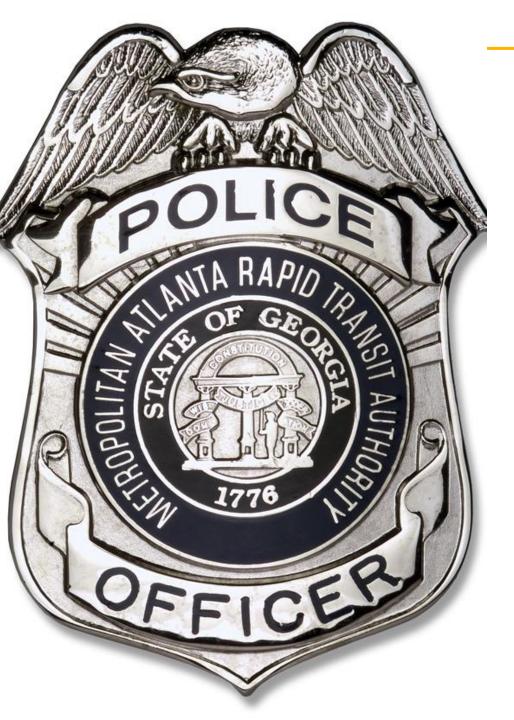

History

- MARTA PD has utilized the psychological services of Stone, McElroy and Associates for well over a decade
- Effective January 1, 2021, Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council (POST) required each peace officer candidate in Georgia to submit to a psychological evaluation



Benefits

Stone, McElroy and Associates offers the following:


- proctored virtual testing
- individual assessments
- secure access to reports via an online portal
- applicant has ability to schedule testing
- quality control by employing second psychologist to review findings





Modifications to current contract

- Access to ProctorPRO, a remote test proctoring service where Stone, McElroy staff proctor testing for Pre-Employment evaluations via HIPAA-compliant Zoom software.
- Increased yearly allotment from 150 preemployment tests to 170 pre-employment tests yearly







Proposed Contract Highlights

- Original three-year contract began in April 2020 for \$179,550 and ends April 2023.
- Contract modification in August 2022 (\$20,310 increase) for \$199,860.
- This modification is for an additional \$146,100 for an additional two years.
- The Office of Diversity and Inclusion did not assign a DBE goal as this is a Professional Services Agreement.

Respectfully requesting authorization for Resolution Authorizing Modification in Contractual Authorization for Professional Services for Police Psychological Pre-Employment Assessment, L45708 with Stone, McElroy, and Associates in the amount of \$146,100.00 for two years which brings this contract with extension to \$345,960 for a total of five years.





STREETCAR BASICS

- We have four Siemens S70 Streetcar vehicles
- All four vehicles currently on a 'safety hold' due to poor wheel condition
- Contract with Siemens to replace these wheels
- To replace wheels, trucks need to be removed and shipped to Siemens








STREETCAR REPAIR UPDATE

- First set of streetcar truck assemblies in Sacramento, CA
- Trucks are disassembled and in process of being rebuilt
- On schedule for February delivery and March return to service (first streetcar)



UTAH TRANSIT AUTHORITY

- Limiting factor: how many truck assemblies we can get into repair
- Dependent on the vehicle lifts and dollies
- Assistance from Utah Transit Authority
- UTA is loaning us a set of dollies
- Doubles pace of repair work





CONTINUITY OF SERVICE

- 3 shuttles currently running
- Wrapped with streetcar theme
- Servicing all stops along route
- Ridership:
 - ~16,000/month pre-hold
 - ~2,200/month with shuttle
- New marketing plan
 - Station announcements
 - Enhanced signage
 - "Promoting the mode"


