ESSENTIAL BUS SERVICE UPDATE

- ✓ COVID-19 markers are worse
- ✓ 50 out of 110 Routes Running
- ✓ Most peer agencies continue to run reduced service
 - ✓ Other systems ridership lower
 - ✓ Some systems don't pick up new passengers when full
 - ✓ Some are cutting due to financial constraints


In the 10-county area...

4,337 newly reported cases, October 25 - 31



- This number is a **16.4% increase** in new cases over last week's 3,727 reported to Georgia DPH.
- This week's new cases result in a **3.3% increase** in total confirmed cases (see next chart) in the week ending October 24.
- Current Georgia DPH estimates expect to see **3,362 new cases*** in the 10-county area between **November 1 to 5**.




RETURN TO NEW NORMAL

OVERVIEW



TRACK WORK SEPTEMBER THROUGH NOVEMBER

- ✓ TR-IV work on the East/West line has been accelerated to take advantage of lower rail ridership.
- ✓ Increased efforts to communicate
- ✓ October work near Westlake and Ashby Stations
 - ✓ 24-hour noise, lights
 - ✓ Rail service impacts
 - ✓ Doorhangers – 400 doors
 - ✓ Nextdoor outreach to affected neighborhoods
 - ✓ Outreach to Councilmembers
- ✓ Zero complaints to Customer Service



- ✓ Canterbury Double Crossover will be replaced in February 2021.
- ✓ There will be several multi-day rail shut-downs between Lindbergh and Lenox and Lindbergh and Buckhead stations.
- ✓ A bus will shuttle affected rail customers
- ✓ MARTAConnect – Uber partnership will be activated


- ✓ An artwork to commemorate three civil rights heroes: C.T. Vivian, Joseph E. Lowery, and John Lewis

MEET DR. HAMILTON E. HOLMES

HAMILTON E. HOLMES, a widely respected Atlanta doctor and educator, is also known for **DESEGREGATING** the University of Georgia and Emory

University School of Medicine. Holmes dedicated his life to serving the Georgia community. An **ATLANTA NATIVE**, he planned to study science at the all-white University of Georgia and become a doctor like his grandfather. Rejected from the University in 1959 because of his race, Holmes joined Charlayne Hunter (later Hunter-Gault), a fellow African-American applicant, to challenge segregation in Georgia's college system.
