






Capital Program

- New floor tile and terrazzo installation
- New second elevator installation

Project Status

- > Twelve (12) of 14 station platforms and bus pads have been poured
- Coordinating with GDOT on traffic signal modification, drainage, and utility system modifications downtown and along Hank Aaron Dr.
- Target opening for revenue service is April 2026
- As of August 2025, the entire \$12.6 M FY2017 Tiger Grant has been drawn down in advance of the September 30, 2025, sunset date, maximizing the federal contribution

Construction Impacts

- Construction along most of the corridor
- Working on detour along Hank Aaron Drive to prepare for construction of remaining stations
- Preparations for paving in downtown

Proof of Payment

- Breeze machines at each station or the Mobile App will be used to purchase tickets before boarding at any door
- Trips will transfer automatically from train and bus rides to BRT







RAPID Response Team

Public Engagement

- Monthly digital communications including website updates, social media posts, and neighborhood project email updates
- Participating in community outreach events

Five Points Transformation (Plaza level)

Mobilization/Deconstruction/Demolition

- Executed in May 2025
- Deconstruction/demo permits issued
- Right of way permits completed
- Pedestrian access will be maintained during mobilization and construction
- Heavier equipment arrival in Nov 2025

Ashby services relocation - ongoing

- GPC connections to be completed in August 2025
- COA DWM connection were completed in August 2025
- Services relocation in September 2025














Five Points Station Rehab


- New floor and wall tile installation

Target Completion: Spring 2026



Cleveland-Metropolitan Arterial Rapid Transit (ART)

- Final design complete
- MARTA bid date closed in September
- Construction start target: Early 2026
- Construction completion target: End of 2028







MARTA RAPID Campbellton/Greenbriar Transit Hub

Environmental Review & Design

- Advanced design to 30% for Campbellton Rd
- Advanced design to 15% for flyover segment
- Substantial completion15% design on the Greenbriar Transit Hub site
- Preparing solicitation for FTA TOD Pilot Study
- Submitted technical reports to FTA
- Substantial completion of Right-of-Way assessment









Bankhead Station Platform Extension

- 60% design submitted to MARTA: Jun 2025
- Review completion: Aug 2025
- Expected final design completion: Q2 2026
- Expected construction start: Q4 2026
- 30-month construction duration












Essential Rider

I-285 Express Lane Transit Study

- Ongoing coordination with GDOT's I285 Top End Express Lanes program
- Study was completed August 2025
- Contract was extended 1-year to advance 15% design and continue coordination with stakeholders






Partially Funded Projects



GA 400 Bus Rapid Transit

- Coordinating with GDOT to deliver BRT operating in SR 400 Express Lanes from Windward Parkway to North Springs
- GDOT closed financing with SR 400 Peach Partners in developer in August 2025
- Next step will be to progress the station designs.







Automated Transit Network (ATN) Pilot

- AACIDs and MARTA have a goal to demonstrate the capabilities of an ATN system
- Design progressing through the end of 2025
- Construction to begin 2026








ATN Feasibility Study

- MARTA leading feasibility study of a larger ATN network in the south metro
- Looking to understand for a full-scale ATN Network:
 - Cost
 - Benefits
 - Constructability
 - Impacts
- We had a Stakeholder Committee meeting on September 25
- Progressing through Existing Conditions and an Industry Review






Unfunded Projects



South Fulton Parkway Transit Initiative/ Roosevelt Highway Arterial Rapid Transit

- South Fulton Parkway ART and BRT alternatives from College Park Station to SR-92
- Roosevelt Highway Three ART route alternatives from East Point Station to City of Fairburn, Fairburn Park-and-Ride and Palmetto
- Not awarded USDOT BUILD grant to advance projects
- Completed Implementation Plans to memorialize path forward once funding is recognized




