What is MARTA Police doing to combat employee assaults?

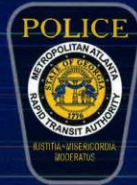
The MARTA Police Department's goal is to provide a safe and secure environment for our employees and customers. The department aggressively addresses all crime trends that include employee assaults.

Weapons in the Workplace

MARTA values the safety of its employees and strives to maintain the safest possible work environment. To make the workplace as safe as possible, MARTA prohibits any employee, other than sworn MARTA police officers, from possessing and/or using any type of weapon on MARTA property.

A Weapon is defined as:

Any firearm or other dangerous object, to include but not be limited to:

- any device from which a projectile may be fired by an explosive;
- any simulated firearm operated by gas or compressed air;
- sling shot;
- metal knuckles;
- any spring blade knife or any knife with a blade longer than five inches; and,
- any instrument that can be used for offense or defense and poses a risk of injury.

Weapons in the Workplace (Cont.)

Possession or use of a weapon while engaged in official MARTA business, or in any MARTA vehicle, is also prohibited. Possession of a firearm in an employee vehicle is also prohibited while such vehicles are parked on any Authority property designated as employee parking. Possession of a license to carry a firearm does not exempt an employee from this policy

Any employee who observes a weapon in the workplace should contact MARTA police immediately at 404-848-4911. If an employee is observed to be in possession of a weapon in violation of this policy, the supervisor of the employee committing the alleged violation will be notified of the incident by MPD. The incident should be documented in writing by the supervisor for further action.

Any employee who violates this policy will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including separation of employment. In addition, an employee may be subject to criminal charges..

Information to Remember

1. Avoid confronting disorderly individuals. Contact MARTA Police (MPD) and, if possible, move to a safe location and wait for police to arrive
2. Don't threaten the individual with calling the police or having them removed from the area. Allow the element of surprise to work in your favor.
3. If the person requests to exit the premises while you are waiting for the police, allow them to exit but be observant of their clothing, height, weight, direction of travel, and if you know whether or not the subject is a an employee, a regular rider, or someone else.
4. Employees must be willing to assist MPD or the local jurisdiction with investigating the incident.
5. Once an arrest has been made, you must attend court to assist with prosecuting the case.
