MPD 2025 Accomplishments

- 2025 TSA Gold Standard Award (17 categories of security and emergency preparedness)
- Real Time Crime Center (RTCC)
- CALEA (The Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies) annual audit completed with no discrepancies
- 2025 SEPP (Security and Emergency Preparedness Plan) approved by GDOT
- New CAD/RMS system for electronic report writing/reporting and tracking (old system was 30 years aged)





MPD 2025 accomplishments continued...

- Full upgrade to Motorola radio Communication system
- Operation Flip the Fleet to restore MPD's aging fleet
- Purchased new EOD truck for state of the art for deployment

- Upgrades to MCV to utilize as a redundant EOC if needed



MPD Training Unit Highlights

- Conducted one full-scale and two TTX exercises
- Prepared 64 new recruits for the police academy (12 to 22 weeks) with zero failures
- Trained 62 MPD officers in Civil Disturbance in preparation for local and world events
- Bike training for 11 officers for Rapid Response Teams
- 160 officers attended Response to Bombing Incident Class
- 152 trained in Prevention of Bombing Incidents Class
- 236 officers and non-sworn trained to carry Narcan
- PCC trained on Crisis Intervention and CPR for Telecommunicators
- All sworn completed required annual In-Service Training and Firearms qualifications
- Specialized 3-day course from the IACP on Front-Line Supervision for all Sergeants and Corporals



MPD Staffing/Recruiting

- Current sworn staffing at ~268
- Successful recruitment trip to Puerto Rico in April 2025
- 32 police recruits attending academy (FT in May)
- Currently 8 new hires awaiting academy
- Fully staffed sworn FTEs with FY26 funding but increased incrementally with additional funding through FY26 with support from leadership to create more FTE sworn positions and additional non-sworn Field Protective Specialist positions
- With leadership support, compensation package is now one of the most competitive in the region
- YOY 52% increase in sworn hires; 43% increase in sworn applications







WC26 Overview

- **Host Nations:**
 - USA, Mexico, and Canada
 - 16 Host Cities
 - 48 Teams
 - 104 Matches between June 11th through July 19th
- **Match Day:**
 - Expects crowds 3 hours prior to match start time.
 - 90-minute matches with 15-min halftime.
 - Assume 2-hour match time, excluding celebrations afterward.
 - Fanfest at Centennial Olympic Park

 - **Fanfest activations (Centennial Olympic Park)**
- **Other Atlanta Metro Activities:**





